In Moesia Inferior, colonization in urban and rural areas involves the military factor, while on the Rhine limes, the military factor attires colonists from civilian milieu. The achievement of the contrastive approach in Moesia Inferior has proved that in the civilian milieu, the soldiers and their descendants represent a decisive factor. In Germania Superior, the military presence dynamizes the economy, but colonization is weaker from a quantitative and qualitative point of view
